1. Read five myths.
2. Find out about clothes worn in ancient Greece or Rome. Make your own toga or tunic and a wreath for your head.
3. Many games that we play today were also played in ancient Greece and Rome. Find out which games have roots in Greece and Rome. Have a game night with your troop or family.
4. Similar gods and goddesses exist in Greek and Roman mythology. Find out about seven and the areas they ruled. For example, the goddesses of love are Aphrodite (Greek) and Venus (Roman).
5. Find out about mosaic art. Complete a mosaic project.
6. The Greeks and Romans built many temples and other buildings for their gods. Find pictures of some of these buildings. What were they used for?
7. What did the Greeks and Romans eat? Find some recipes that might have been used in ancient Greece and Rome and try the food or drink.
8. The Greek Olympics were for men only. Women participated in the Heraea, games held during a festival for the goddess Hera. Find out what kinds of competitions were included in the Heraea and hold your own games.
9. Many constellations are named for mythical people. Find out which constellations you can see from where you live and identify them.
10. Ancient Romans used letters to represent numbers. Find out the Roman numerals for 1, 5, 10, 50, 100, 500, and 1,000. Convert your birthday to Roman numerals. How would you write the current year in Roman numerals?

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
