To earn this Interest Project patch, you must complete at least seven (7) activities from the following categories:

- 2 activities from **Skill Builders**,
- 1 activity from **Technology**,
- 1 activity from **Service Project**,
- 1 activity from **Career Exploration**, and
- 2 activities from any category you choose.



Skill Builders

1. Read the book chosen for APPR.
2. Attend a live performance or video presentation of the book. Discuss the differences between the book and show with others who have read the book and reviewed the same performance.
3. Enter the "All Pikes Peak Reads" (APPR) writing project and competition.
4. Attend one of the events associated with APPR. Discuss three things you learned with others who may not have attended the event.
5. Repeat requirement number 4 with a different event.

Technology

1. Use a software application (such as Microsoft Word) to determine the reading level of two different passages from the book. Each passage must be at least 150 words long. Choose one of the passages and modify it to decrease the reading level. What did you have to do to decrease the reading level?
2. Use a software application (such as Microsoft PowerPoint) to create a family tree of the characters in the book, a flowchart or timeline of the events, or a concept map or story web that depicts the interconnections between characters or events.
3. Use a software application to create a geographical map of the book's setting or a floor plan for a room or building depicted in the book.

Service Project

1. Volunteer to assist with one of the many of the APPR events in the community. Contact the event organizer and determine what kind of help is required. Volunteer for at least three hours.
2. Volunteer to read passages of the book to senior citizens or blind persons in your community. Read at least three chapters of the book to this audience.

Career Exploration

1. Attend a scheduled panel discussion of authors or experts. Prepare at least five questions concerning careers and ask at least one (if possible) during the discussion.
2. Interview the coordinator for one of the events. What kinds of things did she have to consider when planning the event? What kind of training did she have to allow her to plan a successful event?
3. Interview one of the judges for the writing competition. Why was she selected to be a judge? How were the criteria established for the contest? What does she look for when judging writing?
